Displaying books and showing students different genres is a great way to encourage independent reading and interaction with a classroom library or a school media center.

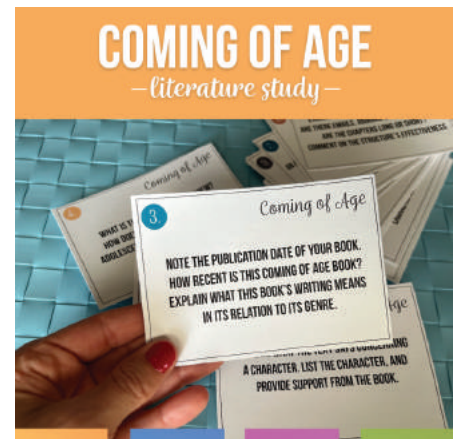
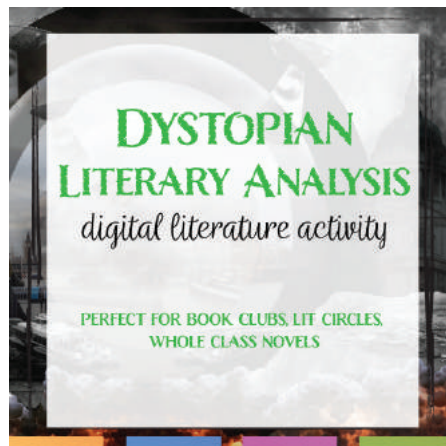
Older students might not understand different genres. You do NOT need to spend money on a display! Show students different books and define the genre for them.

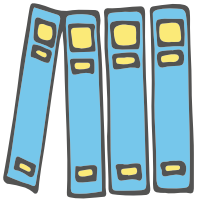
IDEAS FOR IMPLEMENTATION:

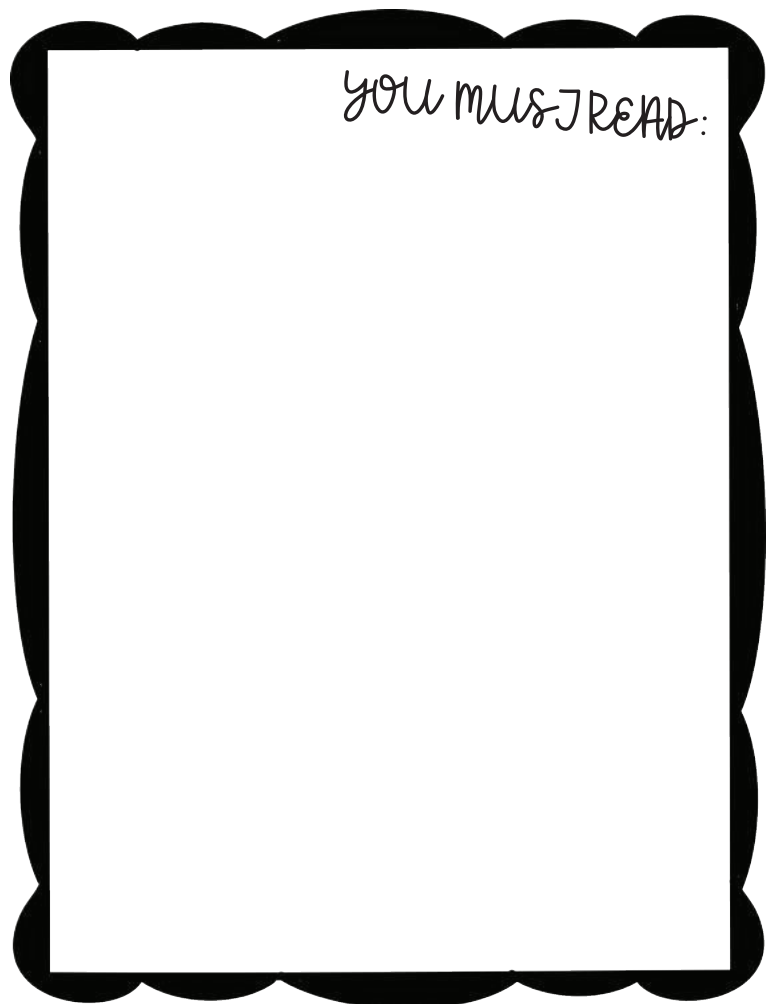
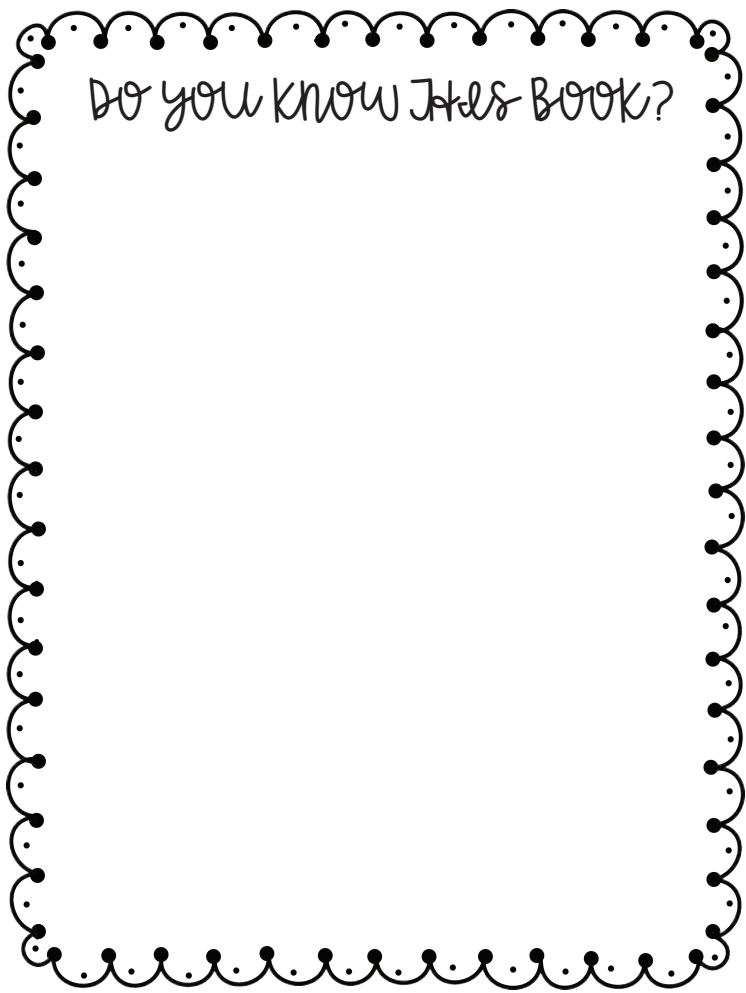
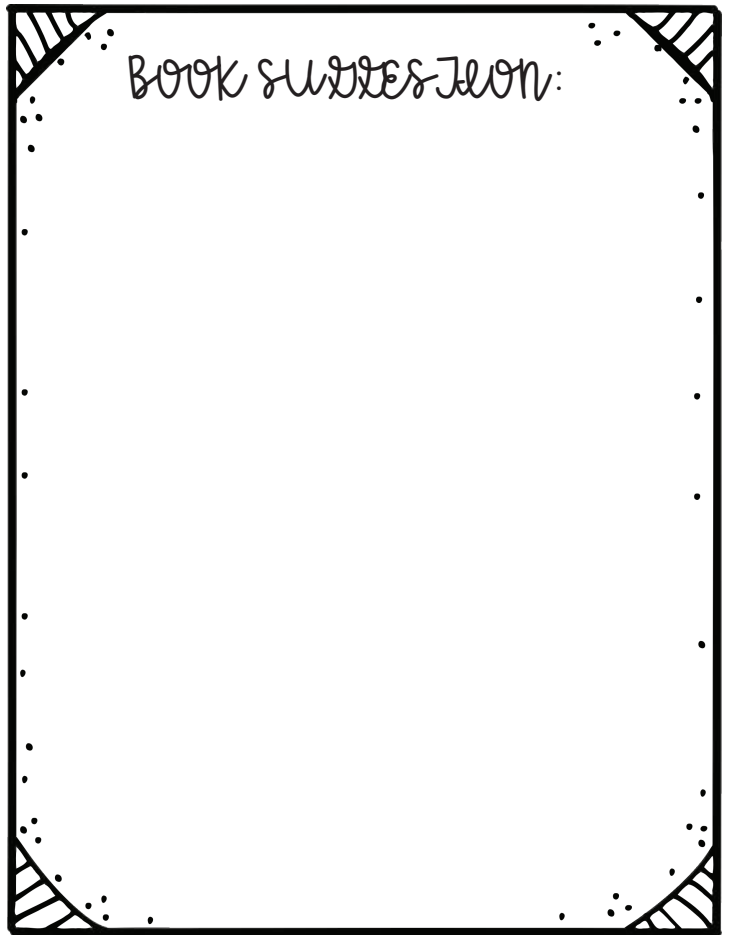
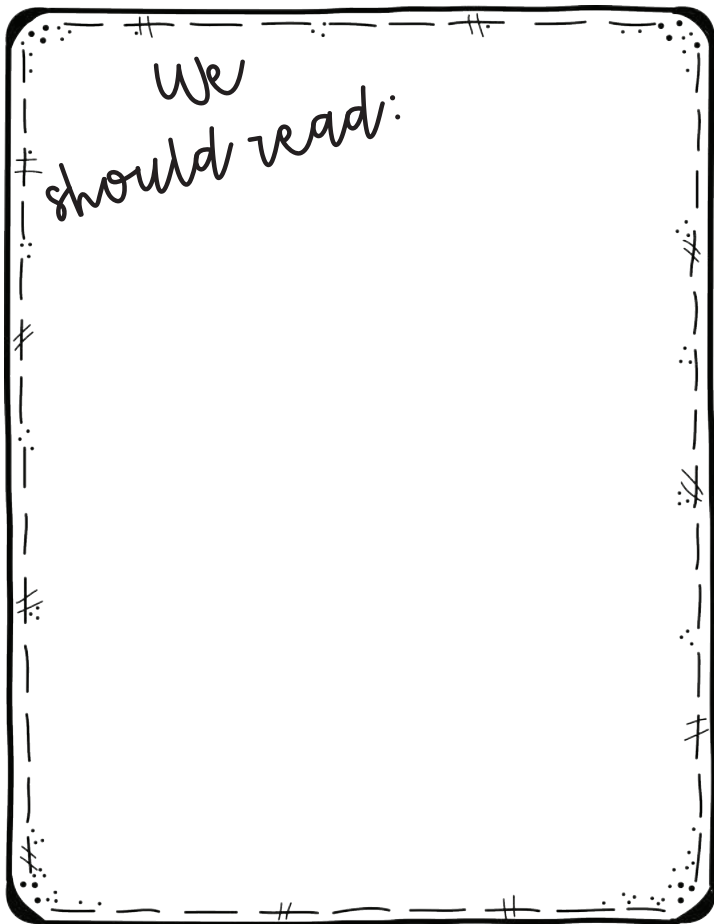


- 1 Start early: freshmen orientation
