- « Conditional Mood: shows a “condition” – if one action happens, another action could happen.
- « Imperative Mood: indicates a state of demand.
- « Interrogative Mood: asks a question.
- « Indicative Mood: shows a fact.
- « Subjunctive Mood: shows a hypothetical state, or a condition that is not reality.
