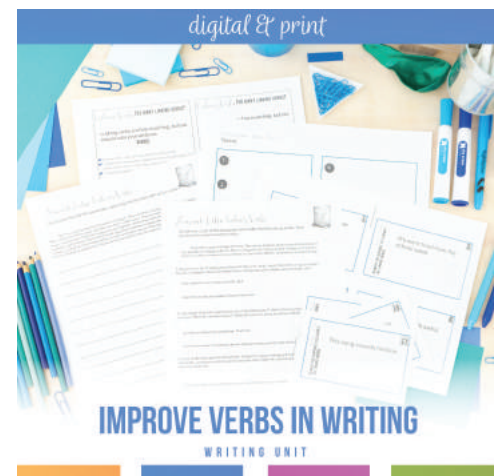
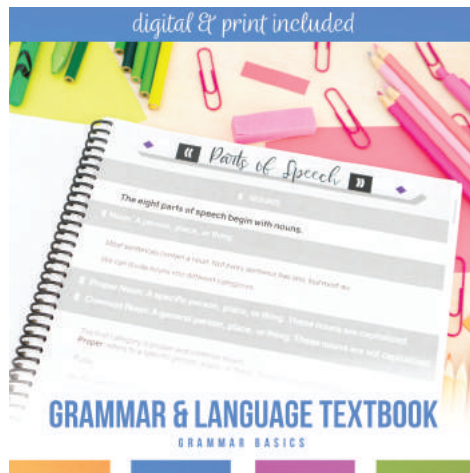

What is an Infographic?

A digital Infographic is a fun take on graphic organizers. It is a modern approach for students to organize facts or character information. Students see infographics on social media and advertisements.

How do I use the Infographics in Google Classroom?

- * Click on the link provided. (Be sure you are signed into Google).
- * Click File, Make a copy.
- * Give the file a name.
- * The new file will be in your Google Drive, and you can share it with your students on Google Classroom!

How can I use these?

Dependent upon your goal, you can use these several ways.

*If I assign these for review (often at the end of a novel), I will assign the file to the class. Then I designate a student group to work on each character. At the end of the class period, I turn the edit off for students, and they each have a study guide we made as a class.

* I will give each student a copy. They then complete the Infographic individually or with a partner. I have them turn in the assignment when they finish. I display different ones as we close the lesson. This allows students to take individual notes.

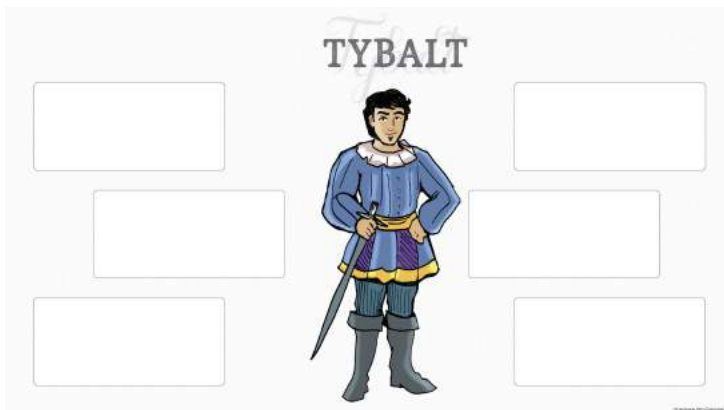
